Important Information:

- ICD-10 went into effect October 1, 2015.
- NYS Department of Health no longer supports Products of Ambulatory Surgery (PAS) rates.
- EAPG payment is based on severity of the episode of care and includes tests, drugs, implants, etc., in a single case rate.
- NYS Worker's Compensation base rate will be 150% of Medicaid Hospital rates. Statewide base rates will be 150% of the Medicaid rates.
- The Board will be using the 3M Core Grouper software.
- Crosswalk Codes are posted on the Board's website.
